Kitschy

A hodgepodge of patterns, prints, and color. Large and small unrelated prints are combined; use stripes in a shared color to differentiate the two. Bright hues, prints, and added layers also achieve this style. '70s florals and cutesy cartoon characters are musts.

Savvy and ethnic styling rules the runways.

'40s Thrift

Emphasis on silhouettes such as the full skirt, dainty short-sleeve blouse, and Bermuda shorts. Check patterns and dots are perfect prints on sheer chiffon tops; details include pin tucks and Peter Pan collars. High waistlines are accentuated with belts and short jackets. Use white as a base; pair with shades of teal and peach.



Gypsy Queen



A mixed-media, floor-sweeping skirt (solids and prints combined layer upon layer) defines this look to the fullest. Mismatched print tops feature sequin and metallic details. Rusty hues are key.

Rock Glam

Denim drives it home with grayscale screen print images of Elvis in his early days on Ts. Look for boxy, oversized T silhouettes. Gray and black denim stick with slimmer pant shapes, while ultra-minis and vintage shrunken vests are highlights. Plus, sequin belts and metallic charm appliqués.



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Prairie Chic



A Western flair with prairie skirts and cotton voile tops. White is a must. The knee-length prairie skirt and baby doll top often mix up eyelet, poplin, and lace fabrics within layers and trim. Embroidery on tops and fringe on suede vests are key details.

Long, flowing skirts and heavily embellished tunics are the ethnic spirit. Paisley prints, metallic beading, and sequin appliqué stand out in silk. Wrap dresses allow for additional embroidery on the hem; keyhole necklines take it to the top. Use rich autumnal browns and orange.
